

1138. Breatnach (Caoimhín): Early modern Irish prose reconsidered: the case of *Ceasacht Inghine Guile*.

*In* Ériu 42 (1991), pp. 119–138.

Suggests that CIG represents a reworking of *Erchoitmed Inghine Gulide* by Brian Ó Gnímh some time after 1567, commemorating the military and political achievements of the MacDonnells of Antrim following the Battle of Glenshesk (1565), and commenting on the shared fate and status of patron and *ollamh*.
