

1247. Falileyev (Alexander): Early Irish *céir* ‘bee’s wax’.

*In* *Éigse* 33 (2002), pp. 71–74.

is a loanword from British-Latin dated to the 5th-6th century, contemporary with the introduction of beekeeping into Ireland.
