

1682. Harrison (Alan): 'The soft rump'.

*In Éigse 17/2 (Geimhreadh 1977–1978), p. 236.*

'*Parliamentárians na dtárr maohlach*' from poem beg. *Innisim fíis is ní fíis bhréige í* (= *An Síogaí Rómhánach*, *FSCPP* 22 l. 112) based on Engl 'The Soft Rump', which was used to refer to 'The Rump Parliament' of 6 December 1648, which condemned Charles I to death.
