2417. Henderson (Isabel), Okasha (Elisabeth): The early Christian inscribed and carved stones of Tullylease, Co. Cork.
In CMCS 24 (Winter 1992), pp. 1–36.
Discusses five Lat. inscriptions (incl. the ‘Berichter’ slab) dated to not later than the 10th c.
2418. O’Loughlin (Thomas): The exegetical purpose of Adomnán’s *De Locis Sanctis*.
In CMCS 24 (Winter 1992), pp. 37–53.
Argues that Adomnán’s intent is to facilitate the interpretation of the Scriptures through the study of their topography, as advocated by St. Augustine in *De Doctrina Christiana*.
2419. Brown (Alan K.): Old Irish *astal*, Old English *æstel*: the common etymology.
In CMCS 24 (Winter 1992), pp. 75–92.
Both < Lat. *(h)astella*, originally meaning ‘plectrum’, based on the evidence from an episode of the Irish Life of St. Brendan.
