2601. Greene (David): Modern Irish *cailleann* and *coilleann*.
In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 5–9.
Examines the doublet *cailleann* and *coilleann* (both < OIr. *coillid*) and argues it results from semantic split.
2602. Hartmann (Hans): Synchronische und diachronische Studien zur Syntax des Irischen.
In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 10–157.
[1.] Verbalnomen und Habitualis des Irischen und Verbalnomen, Injunktiv und Imperfekt des Indogermanischen; [2.] Zeit und Geschehen in der Zeit; [3.] Fallen und Stürzen; [4.] Null-Impersonalia ohne und mit Bezeichnung der Ursache. Kräfte der Natur und Verwandtes; [5.] Verlorengehen, sich verirren und sich irren. *Cur amú* und *dul amú*, mir. *techt mudu*; [6.] Aspekt, Zeit oder Erzähltechnik?
2603. Hamp (Eric P.): The north European word for ‘apple’.
In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 158–166.
Argues that OIr. *ubull* derives ultimately from Pre-Celtic **oblu* (comparable to Balto-Slavic **ǎblu*), and argues that this belongs to a group of substratum words where original **a* has given **o* in Celtic.
3211. Hamp (Eric P.): *Celtica Indogermanica*: 3. **H_aap-(Xon-)* ‘river’.

Comments on the Indo-European background of OIr. *ab*.
2604. Hamp (Eric P.): *Celtica Indogermanica*: 4. On Albanian *te*.
In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 170–173.
Argues against the association of Alb. *te* with OIr. (and Celt.) *to-*.
2605. Campanile (Enrico): Indogermanische Metrik und altirische Metrik.
In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 174–202.
Argues, through the critical examination of reconstructed Indo-European metrics, against C. WATKINS’ contention (in *BILL* III: 4420) that Old Irish heptasyllabic verse is a direct inheritance from Indo-European.

2606. Corthals (Johan): Mittelirisch *berthae*.

In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 203–206.

Expands *b⁻tho* in the Egerton 1782 version of *Táin bó Regamna* as *bertho* (= *berthae*, for OIr. *bertae*), vs. the emendation *bretho* by E. WINDISCH (*in IT II*, ii, p. 241).

2607. Lambert (Pierre-Yves): Gaulois IEVRV: irlandais (*ro*)-*ír* “dicaut”.

In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 207–213.

In the light of Gallo-Greek εἰωροῦ (preferred to Gallo-Latin *ieuru*), derives OIr. pret. *-ír* < **iyor-* < **eyor-* < **pepor-*, and argues that *ernaid* and *renaid* are both < PIE **per-* but differentiated by an enlargement *-h₃-* and *-h₁-*, respectively.

2608. Ternes (Elmar): Die Sonderstellung des Bretonischen innerhalb der keltischen Sprachen.

In ZCP 37 (1979), pp. 214–228.

Offers a subdivision of the (Insular) Celtic branch based on the typological analysis of Breton.
