

785. Sayers (William): Varia: IV. Three charioteering gifts in *Táin bó Cúailnge* and *Mesca Ulad*: *immorchor ndelend*, *foscúl ndíriuch*, *léim dar boilg*.

In *Ériu* 32 (1981), pp. 163–167.

*immorchor ndelend*: ‘use of charioteer’s wand to sight a straight course and to hold the chariot on this course over long distances’; *foscúl ndíriuch* (‘straight / level cleaving or sundering’); *léim dar boilg* (‘leaping across a gorge / gap / chasm’ as compliment to the other two skills).
